TRANSITION STUDENTS BEGINNING 2017



Dear Parents, Caregivers and Students,

Welcome to Week 3 everyone. On Friday last week, we delivered the news that all the students had been anxiously awaiting, the results of the school sports day. St Marys finally broke a decade of drought, winning the Championship Shield for the fifth time in its existence. Captains Josh, Layne, Jed & Kye accepted their team's prize with escalation. St Joseph's were worthy winners of the School Spirit Award, a shield they have won on a number of occasions.

The staff attended a Combined Schools staff meeting on Monday at St Joseph's Barmera to learn more about 'What is Differentiation?' This term refers to a targeted process that involves forward planning, programming and instruction. It involves the use of teaching, learning and assessment strategies that are fair and flexible, provide an appropriate level of challenge, and engage students in learning in meaningful ways. Students learn at varying rates and in different ways and these individual differences may influence how they respond to instruction, demonstrate what they know, understand and can do. Between schools, we shared and reviewed current practices to improve future teaching and learning in this area.

Yesterday we celebrated All Saints Day as a Catholic community. This is a holy day of obligation, meaning all Catholics are required to attend Mass. On this day, we celebrate all those who have entered heaven, including saints who are recognised by the Church and those who are not. Following All Saints Day is All Souls Day, a holy day for honouring those who have gone before us. These were both acknowledged in Religious studies lessons and prayer this week in class. On Tuesday, classes gathered in the Senior Unit to watch the 'race that stops the nation' and cheered in the spirit of the occasion. Add this one to your book of experiences; try following a horse race with a class full of students and determine the final placings!

Today, Mrs Moldovan along with NRM crew Ranveer, Charlie, Jaden & Archer attended their final Youth Environment Leader Forum at Calperum Station. They celebrated with lots of hands-on activities, bush tucker treats and a sausage sizzle lunch! Year 7 students Harmon, Callum & Suhail also attended their first transition to Loxton High School and we hope they enjoyed this experience. On Friday this week students will participate in the Jodi-Lee Foundation 'Kay a Day' run at the Berri Football Oval. In Australia, 9 out of 10 young people don't move enough each day. Kay-A-Day is designed to encourage kids to walk or run just one kilometre a day for 21 days – the same distance as a half marathon. Donations received will help us save lives by educating Australians about bowel cancer prevention. Students can be dropped off at the oval in the morning with supervision being provided from 8.30am. The event will run from 9.00am -11.30am with the students returning to school (on foot) by approximately midday. Students will then take part in our Turban and Trust Day.
